Another exciting year at Leppington Public School today draws to a close!!! This year has been not only exciting, memorable and successful but a year of challenges. However as a committed learning community we have risen to the challenges that have come our way and embraced each one with a sense of purpose, optimism and strong teamwork from staff, students and most importantly you, our parents. This year our students have continued to grow in their learning, have eagerly participated in a wide range of activities offered to them both in school and out of the school. As principal I have watched our students grow in confidence, leadership and most importantly in their learning. Our students have all worked extremely hard this year and as a learning community we have made great gains. As I said in my speech on Presentation Day examples of our improvements this year include 68% Year 3 students achieved in top 2 skill bands for writing, 96% Year 2 students are on track for Literacy, a number of high distinctions, distinctions and credits in ICAS tests, Year 5 students all achieved more than one band growth in NAPLAN, very close to state average for VALID Science test for Year 6. These are just some of our achievements. I know that I speak for all staff when I say that we are very proud of the achievements of all of our students this year.
