Skipping Program

Next term from week 1-8 we are running a whole school skipping program commencing on **Friday 18**th **October 2019**. The program is run by Dance Fever Multisports. The program is designed to meet the NSW PDHPE Syllabus outcomes with a focus on the introduction of fundamental movement skills through participation in skipping. Our students will learn

about the positive health aspects of participating in physical activity in a supervised and safe environment. Each coach is accredited by Gymnastics NSW and qualified to teach in schools. This is a new initiative for our school and we hope that all students will participate.


