NAPLAN Results

Our NAPLAN results for 2019 were available from the end of term 3. It was exciting to see the improvements across all areas that our students have achieved. A few highlights included:

Year 3

- 50% students achieved in top 2 skill bands for writing—increase from 25% from 2018
- ♦ 49% students achieved in top 2 skill bands in reading-increase from 28% in 2018

Year 5

- ◆ 72% students achieved at or above expected growth in Numeracy-increase of 6% from 2018
- ♦ 59% students achieved at or above expected growth in writing-above state average
