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Updated Covid Information

Last week we sent home updated advice from the department regarding changes to school routines and for staff and students. Please read the information carefully. Before they return to school we need to sight the results of the test. Parents are still not able to come into the school unless it is to pick up a sick child. All assemblies and meetings are still on hold. Our breakfast club is once again cancelled indefinitely. All sporting and performing arts events outside of the school are also cancelled until further notice.

Little Learners Program

Unfortunately we have also had to cancel our in school Little Learners program. Normally we would have our new kinder students and their parents come into school for a number of sessions in order to familiarise them with the school setting but instead we are in the process of organising all of those students who will start in kindergarten next year onto Class Dojo. Afternoon Dismissal


Online Check In Tests








5/6 Blue News
