From the Principal's desk

It has been a very settled start to term 4. This term we welcomed a number of new families to our school and we hope that they soon feel part of the Leppington community.

This term our school leadership team has been busy planning for next year. One of the important areas that we are working on is developing a new school plan for the next three years. To start the process we need complete a situational analysis of where we are across a number of areas and where we need to go. To do this we have examined data from a number of areas including student performance measures, well being, our finance reports, our enrolment data and attendance. As part of this process we will be asking for parental feedback and suggestions. A very big "Thank You" to the thirty plus parents who completed the survey. That was a fantastic result. Your responses from the Tell Them From Me survey will be invaluable for this process.

As of this week we are expecting an enrolment next year of over 400 students which for us could possibly be 18 classes. We are expecting over 90 kindergartens!

It has been wonderful to see our students working very hard in class towards achieving their learning goals. Over the last week I have been visited by a number of students to show their writing or to read to me. I have been impressed by the progress that I can see across the school. Unfortunately we are still governed by a number of restrictions in accordance to health guidelines so parents are still not able to come into our school. We do miss seeing our mums and dads coming in especially for special events such as Book Week this week, for kindergarten orientation and for our end of year functions. We are hoping that restrictions for these later events might be eased.

This week is the first of our kindergarten orientation sessions with a very different format this year due not just to covid restrictions but also to the large number of kindergarten students we have enrolled for next year-90 last count! They'll only be in for
